HASI aims to support people living with a mental illness to maintain and enhance their housing, Participate in community life, increase their functioning and enhance their overall wellbeing. Target Groups • Clients have greater levels and duration o

High Support (up to 35 hours per week)

- Aged 16-65 years
- Diagnosed with a mental illness
- Experiencing a moderate to severe level of psychiatric disability
- Established public housing or eligible for public housing
- Homeless or at risk of homelessness
- Low level of functioning

Low Support (3-5 hours per week)

- 16 years and upwards
- Own accommodation in social/public housing established
- Have a low level of psychiatric disability
- Have the capacity to benefit from the program
- Have a high level of functioning most of the time

Service Activities

- Provide holistic recovery focused case
 management
- Assisting client to gain and maintain long term tenancy
- Develop and maintain relationships with other support agencies
- Provide advocacy and referrals for clientsConduct home visits and assists with
- transportation to appointments and activities
- Assisting in developing clients life skills
- Assist in accessing appropriate primary, secondary and tertiary health services
- Enhance social inclusion
- Mental health support and education
- Provision or coordination of access to activities that promote personal development, health, recreation, and self-worth and community involvement
- Strengthen relationship with other support organisations

Outcomes

- Clients are maintaining their tenancy
- Clients have improved relationships with housing provider
- Reduced demand on emergency and health services, reduction in costs to health system
- Improved social/ community participation

- Clients have greater levels and duration of recovery and rehabilitation
- Clients have improved mental and physical health and emotional wellbeing
- Improved levels of functioning and life skills
- Enhanced relationship with clinical mental health support
