

14th ADAN Symposium

The 14th annual ADAN Symposium was held from the 3rd to the 5th of March. The Symposium brought together Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) workers to build partnerships, engage in cultural and peer support, share stories and initiatives, as well as provide insights into the current trends and approaches into AOD treatment, care and management for Aboriginal Communities.

The three-day Symposium included cultural ceremonies, panel discussions and presentations from industry experts and inspirational Aboriginal people working in the AOD field.



National Indigenous Youth Empowerment Summit

The National Indigenous Youth Empowerment Summit was held from the 25th to the 26th of February. The Summit brought together workers from various sectors to share successes, create partnerships, improve service delivery to young people and most importantly give Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people a voice to ensure the health system is supporting them to live a healthy and happy life.

The four-day Summit was filled with presentations from industry leaders and truly inspirational individuals who are not only changing the sector but also setting an example for the next generation.

Industry Updates and Resources



Australian Government

As of Sunday the 22nd of March 2020 in light of COVID-19 the Australian Government announced a Second Stimulus Package. Small businesses, including Non for Profits, with an annual turnover of less than \$50 mil will be provided up to \$100k through the Australian Tax Office (ATO) as a credit on their Business Activity Statements (BAS).

First credits are expected to be processed in late April 2020, payments will be processed into the nominated bank account where usual refunds for the BAS are made by the ATO. We advise Members to make sure that all BAS lodgements are up to date as it is not clear whether small businesses whose lodgements are not up to date will receive payments.
